Isaiah sees the vision of the child Immanuel. Isaiah is kneeling and writing his prophecy.

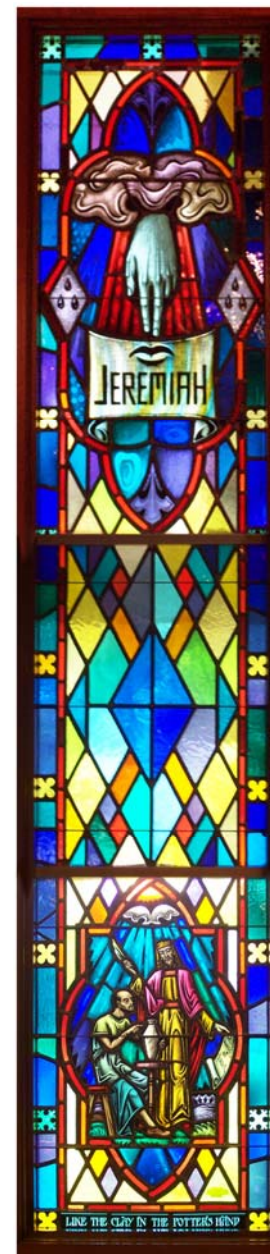
SYMBOLS

Chapter six of the prophecy is represented. The wings of the seraphim are at the top.

The tongs are in the center with the live coal from the altar with which the lips of the prophet, seen on the scroll, were cleansed.

The scroll, with the name of Isaiah, represents his prophetic office.

The pruning hooks made from spears are at the sides (Isaiah 2).



Jeremiah the Prophet

Like the clay in the potter's hand

Jeremiah, with the quill and scroll of prophecy, is visiting the potter, who is making a vessel on the wheel (Jeremiah 18).

The potter is explaining the making of a vessel to Jeremiah.

SYMBOLS

The hand is that of the Lord, which touched Jeremiah's lips.

The cloud and rays are witness to the divine appointment of the prophet.

The scroll with the name Jeremiah represent his prophetic mission.

The tears are a traditional symbol of "the weeping prophet."
